#### **Sports Day Arrangements:**

You will have noticed that the school field is currently out of action and in previous newsletters I mentioned that we would need to make alternative arrangements for Sports Days this year. We have devised a Sports Day with a difference and you are very welcome to come and spectate and support the children as usual. Please see the details below...

We have organised a Round Robin of sporting activities which will take place on the back KS2 playground. The children will be spilt into mixed age group teams and rotate around a variety of activities e.g. hula hooping, egg and spoon, throwing bean bags at a target, kicking balls towards a goal, dribbling around skittles etc. These activities will be led by staff, taking place around the edge of the playground at various stations. Each team will collect points at each station and these will be recorded on a central sheet. We will then total the scores and award the trophy to the winning team or House Captains. As we will be rotating around the outside of the playground parents (and grandparents) will be able to sit on benches in the centre of the playground and rotate around to follow their child/children. We will aim to keep siblings in the same teams so you are only following one group!

The Key Stage One Sports Day will take place at 9.30am on Wednesday 21.06.17 and the Key Stage Two Sports Day will take place on Thursday 22.06.17, also at 9.30am. Please note that these dates are dependent on the weather. We will text to cancel and offer alternative dates if it is wet. If it is sunny please remember to provide your child with a hat and sun cream.

Please note that space will be limited in the central area for parents and we would ask that you remain in the central part to enable us to safeguard the children at all times. It may be a bit of a squash depending on how many spectators arrive so please bear with us.

We hope that this makes sense and we will have a lovely time. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to contact us. As always, we fully understand that you may want to take photographs of your child but please be sensitive of other families and do not upload images to Facebook or other social networks. #### Trim Trail:

You will have noticed our lovely new Trim Trail on the Key Stage One playground I am sure. We are extremely grateful to the Parents' Association for raising money to pay for this expensive piece of equipment and we are delighted with the end result (as are the children). We are in the process of training the children how to use it safely and making them aware of the rules which are as follows:

We are using it mainly during lessons at the moment and for occasional playtimes whilst the children get used to how to play safely. We have noticed that it is being used before and after school too, which is obviously fine, but we would like to make to clear that this will be <u>the responsibility of the parents to ensure their</u> children are using the equipment safely and appropriately and school will not accept any responsibility for any accidents or issues that occur out of school hours.
